

Charter for safe stay in mountain refuge, for me and for others

In the health context of COVID-19, individual responsibility for limiting the effects of the pandemic is fundamental. This is also the case in the mountains, and more particularly in refuges. The refuge caretakers and owners have adapted the organisation and operation of the refuges to welcome you in the best possible conditions.

It is essential for everyone to comply with the measures and protocols put in place.

I hereby confirm:

- That I am aware that in the current health context, the operation, reception conditions and services offered by the refuge will not be the same as usual;
- That I have taken due note of the specific equipment that I must bring as a result for myself and for my group in order to be able to stay in the refuge (personal protective and disinfection equipment, bedding, duvet, personal linen, etc.).
- That I am aware that failure to comply with health instructions may result in my booking being cancelled by the security guard in order to ensure the safety of as many people as possible in the face of the epidemic.

I also undertake:

- Not to enter the refuge if I or anyone in my group presents potential symptoms of COVID-19 (cough, fever >37.8°C, diarrhoea, nausea, cold, great fatigue, conjunctivitis, loss of taste or smell);
- To comply with the conditions of my booking (number of people, composition of the group, number of nights, type of service (bivouac or dormitory), arrival and meal times, etc.);
- To wash my hands with soap before entering the refuge;
- To comply with rules on social distancing, hand disinfection, wearing of masks, direction of movement in buildings, etc.) and the rules of living in a refuge that have been adapted to each refuge and presented in the specific health protocol available on the refuge's website and presented by the caretaker on my arrival;
- To provide all the appropriate equipment necessary for the health and safety of my group (if applicable) and myself (hydroalcoholic gel, mask, etc.) in addition to the conventional equipment necessary for my safety in the mountains;
- On leaving the refuge, to take charge of all the equipment and material used during my stay and in particular the single-use protection used when I sleep.
